Inter Academies Athletics Championships – July 2015

The annual Inter Academies Athletics Championships was a resounding success, encapsulating the ethos of the Greenwood Dale Foundation Trust. The event is aimed at our elite athletes, with pupils only allowed to enter one track and one field discipline, therefore enabling pupils to excel in specialist areas of athletics.

Held on 15 July at the Princess Royal Arena in Boston, the championships encompassed a wide range of athletics events including shot put, javelin, long jump, discus, triple jump and high jump, alongside conventional track events and 4 x 100m relays.

The Nottingham Girls' Academy opened proceedings with a musical extravaganza by 'Harmony' and an energetic dance performance from 'G13'. This was followed by an inspirational speech from Anthony Clark who is one of Badminton's most prolific and respected players gaining over 100 caps for England, winning seven Commonwealth medals, two World Championship medals and representing Great Britain at two Olympic Games.

Lots of Trust records were broken throughout the day and there were very few points between the winner and the two runners up; however the Stanground Academy was crowned overall girls and boys winners for the fourth consecutive year!
