

Chelsea was a young girl who, having fallen out with her friends and family, was approached by a man called Gary. Gary was older, owned a car, had a flat and treated her like an adult. Unfortunately, Gary was not what he seemed to be!







Chelsea's story is played out and examined by the three students, along with their teacher, in an attempt to

understand what happened to Chelsea and how it could have been prevented.

The 40-minute production and post-show Q&A were highly effective in raising awareness of:

- The Grooming Process
- Child Sexual Exploitation
- Where young people can go for help and advice
