We have continued to improve the site over the summer with new toilets in the Year 11 area, new meeting room pods, and accessible access to the sports hall.

Examination Success

We are hugely proud of our Year 11 Student Leavers who gained **great results** for GCSE and Vocational subjects in August. The students excelled themselves with 64% of all grades awarded being graded at 9- 4 or equivalent.

This is great testament to the hard work of everyone concerned, particularly bearing in mind the challenging times students have faced in the last few years and the return to normality after Covid.





These students are now attending Sixth Forms, Colleges, or Apprenticeships across the city and we wish them every success in the next stage of their lives.







Thorpe Park Reward Event

On Wednesday we took 66 students from the current Years 8, 9 and 10 to Thorpe Park as part of their rewards from the previous academic year.

These students were rewarded for their fantastic commitment to their studies and to the CoPA community. With only one other school at the park, they experienced minimal queuing and maximum rides.

Enrichment

We have changed the school day so that all students have lunch at the same time. Although this makes social times busier, it allows us to run activities at lunchtime and open more spaces for the students to go.

The enrichment timetable now includes both lunch clubs and activities run after school.

If your child wishes to attend any of the published sessions, they just need to go along to the published room on the day either at lunch or at the end of the day.

Year 11 Subject Support after school

Many subjects will be offering both voluntary drop-in sessions and invited support for students starting from Monday 18 September. Once this information has been collated, Miss Donnell will communicate this to all Year 11 students and parents.

School Attendance

Maximising attendance remains a priority for the school. There is an expected **minimum attendance target of 97% attendance** for all students.

To support your child to achieve this, you will be made aware if attendance is becoming a concern, e.g., when attendance falls to 97%. By raising awareness early, we hope to prevent attendance falling to the 90% threshold, at which point schools are duty bound to follow up and could instigate legal action for non-attendance.

Your support in helping raise the profile of good attendance would be very much appreciated.

Emergency First Aid and Medical Conditions

The Academy always ensures that First Aid trained staff are available should the need arise. It is vital we know about any medical conditions your child may have including any changes or updates on this information e.g. allergies, asthma, EpiPen usage etc.

- Forward a letter from the Hospital
- Permission to Administer Medications Form available from Reception only

Updating Contact Information

Have you made any changes to your contact information that we currently hold for you?

This is particularly important so that we can contact parents/ carers in the event of an emergency or first aid issue. You can also update other details such as your child's photo permissions. Free School Meals and Pupil Premium Funding

If your child is eligible for 'free school meals' (FSMs) and you register them for this, we'll receive extra funding called 'pupil premium'. We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources at the school including funding extra teaching staff, textbooks, school trips, transport, and uniform.

Your child might be eligible if you access:

- Income Support
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

You only need to register once at the school. Pupil Premium students automatically qualify for FSMs. To register, either collect a Notts CC paper form from Reception or register via the link on our website here.

We saw some issues with traffic build up at the end of the school day on Thursday. This causes distress to all involved and we want to **work with our community to ensure that students are safe** when leaving our site and that we are not causing disruption to our neighbours.

We share our entrance with Medeshamstede Special School; many of their students require taxi transport to and from school. This increases traffic significantly from 3pm.

Ideally CoPA students would walk, cycle or use public transport to travel to and from school. However, if this is not possible and you are needing to drive them, **please do not park on the double yellow lines** in the entrance area to the school or on Reeves Way around this entrance.

We strongly discourage parents from driving onto our site as we do not have designated parent spaces or a turning circle. Driving onto the site decreases the safety of students and further increases delays for vulnerable Medeshamstede students.

You may want to arrange to meet your child away from the school entrance.

We have contacted our neighbourhood police to provide us with support and will continue to monitor the situation.
