CoPA rated **GOOD** by OFSTED – July 2023



On Monday, we were able to share our OFSTED report with the community. The day started with sign fitters fixing new signs to the front gate and the back of the school. All staff received a "CoPA is Good" t-shirt which they were asked to keep secret.



The community celebrations started when students were treated to music on the field at lunchtime. During Period 5, I delivered an online assembly explaining that CoPA had moved its OFSTED grading from Inadequate to Good in just 18 months. Whilst I was online, hundreds of balloons were placed around the school in all the corridors.

Classes came out onto the field in the warm sunshine, starting with Year 11, collecting balloons on the way and assembling under the large banner. All Year 7 students were provided with t-shirts to wear.



When the whole school was assembled, Mr Paul flew his drone into the air, confetti cannons sent silver confetti into the air and students released biodegradable balloons. All students were then given sweets to complete the celebrations.

CoPA Sixth Form Partnership with The Peterborough School


